DAY-2



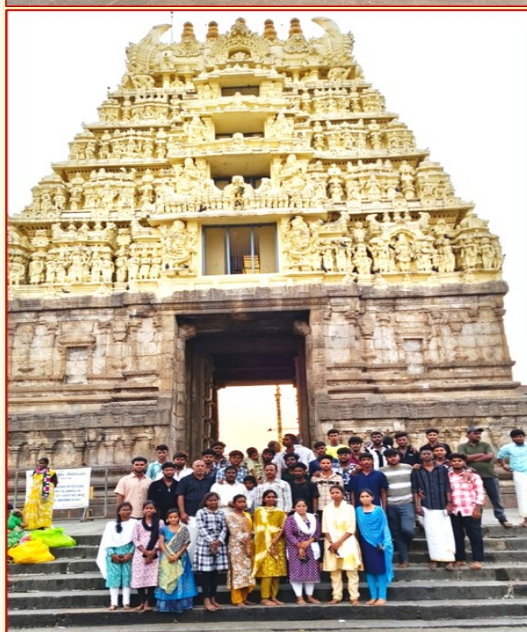

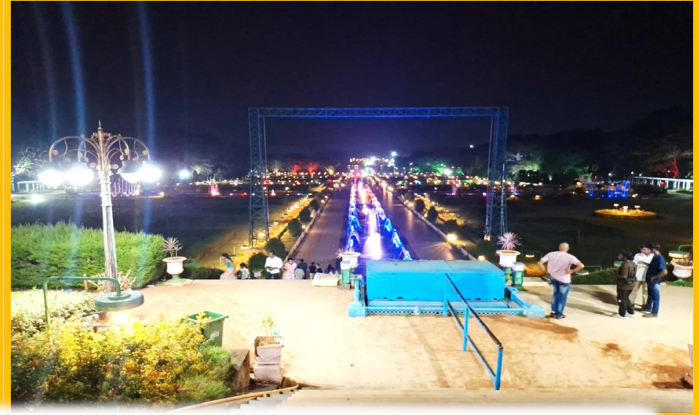

Shifting toward the psychosocial dimension, Saleem Garu delivered a poignant analysis of the systemic physiological suffering and palliative needs experienced by patients in real-world clinical settings. Concluding the session, Dr. P. Giridhar provided a meticulous overview of early symptomatic indicators and the current therapeutic modalities, ranging from surgical intervention to advanced chemotherapeutic protocols.

The medical team, led by Dr. Adishesu, executed a sophisticated diagnostic battery including Random Blood Sugar (RBS) monitoring, Sphygmomanometry (BP), Electrocardiography (ECG), and Transthoracic 2D Echocardiography. This proactive health intervention effectively utilized specialized staff and advanced imaging to evaluate cardiac function and metabolic risk factors within the academic community.



In a strategic public health initiative, the Red Ribbon Club (RRC) and its dedicated volunteers successfully distributed 2,000 Albendazole tablets to the student body. These medicinal doses serve as a critical intervention against helminthic infestations, which typically occur through the ingestion of contaminated food and water. By targeting intestinal parasites, the medication effectively neutralizes and eliminates these organisms from the digestive system via natural metabolic pathways. Under the guidance of the college administration, this mass deworming effort reinforces the institution's commitment to maintaining a healthy, parasite-free campus environment.

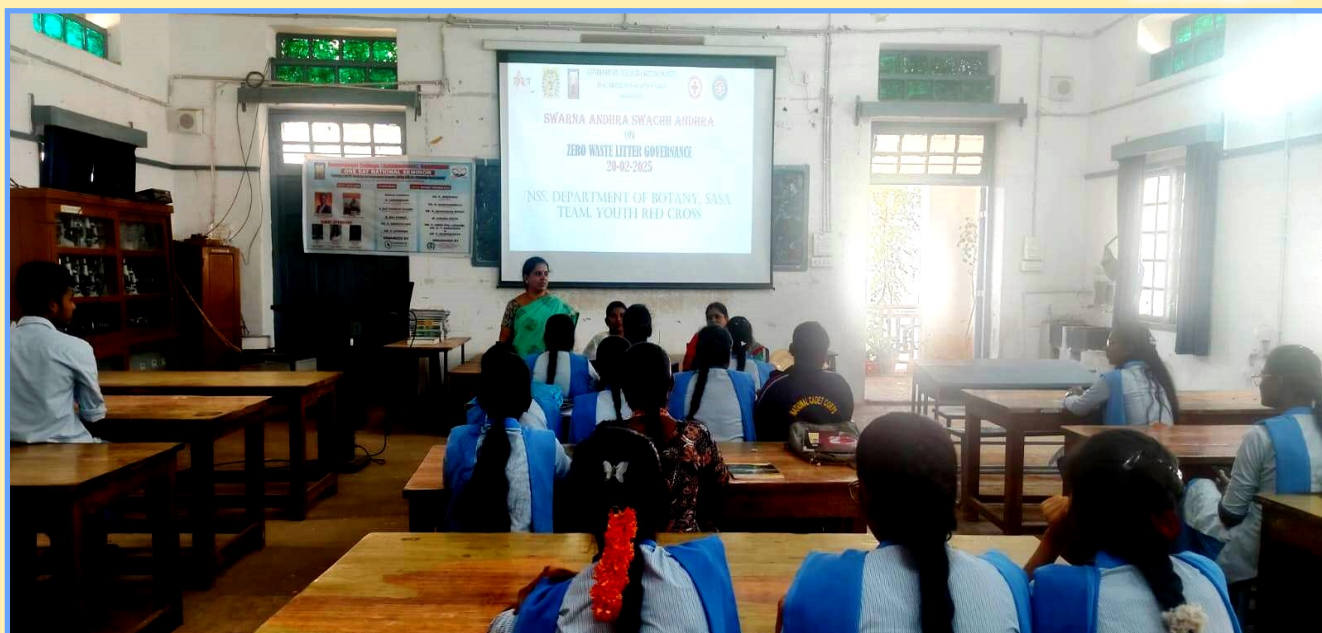
